HEAT ILLNESS

Three Important Things Parents Need to Know About Heat-Related Illness in Young Athletes

- 1) **Heat Acclimation**: Gradual increase in activity duration and intensity over 10-14 days is best
- 2) **Drink Plenty of Water**: Staying hydrated BEFORE, DURING, and AFTER activity is the easiest way to prevent heat-related illness
- 3) **Early Recognition**: Parents and coaches are key; if your athlete is not behaving typically and the conditions are right for heat illness act!

Quick recognition of heat-related illness signs and symptoms:

Disorientation

Dizziness, weakness

Unusual behavior

Headache

Vomiting


