ARMY EMERGENCY RELIEF (AER)



AER Annual Campaign March 8 through June 15

- Goals Are:
 - 100% awareness of AER Assistance
 - 23% donation rate from Soldiers
 - \$150,000 in campaign donations
- AER Officer and staff to coordinate on-post campaign
- AER Campaign staff to address IET Soldiers and collect funds
- Cadre Soldiers will have a rep in each Unit for campaign level

GLWACH

For Awareness

- ✓ GLWACH disability evaluation process:
 - Service members are referred by PCM to Medical Evaluation Boards (MEB).
 - MEB providers review and determine if the service member is at medical retention determination point.
 - If so, they are entered into the disability evaluation system. If not, they are returned to duty with a note to their commander and provider.
 - The integrated disability evaluation system takes approximately 210 days to complete.
- ✓ Delays exist in processing due to COVID-19 and VA telework
- ✓ The Physical Evaluation Board is behind due to increase in incoming cases.

Challenges/Initiatives

- COVID Vaccination mission continues. GLWACH is planning a second mass vaccination event for March 5-6, 2021. The primary focus will be all those needing **second doses** to complete series.
- Challenges with receiving sufficient resupply of vaccine to continue vaccinating with first doses while ensuring all second doses are given.





Spring Top Weather Event “Flash Flooding”

Flooding is the deadliest weather hazard in Missouri. From 2015 through 2019, 40 of Missouri’s 50 flooding deaths were people who had been in vehicles during a **flash flood**.



Flash Flood Facts

- Never expect barriers to block off flooded low-water crossings or bridges.
- Some motorists never see the high water until it’s too late because of poor visibility due to darkness or heavy rain.
- Be alert for high water whenever flash flooding is forecast.
- Slow down when visibility is limited.
- Turn around. Don’t drown.
- Never think that because you made it across a flooded low water crossing in the past that you’ll make it the next time.
- Never be tempted to drive into floodwater because it appears shallow.
- Less than a foot of moving water is enough to push a vehicle.
- If you wind up in flood water and your vehicle stalls, leave it immediately and seek higher ground. Rapidly rising water may engulf the vehicle and sweep it away.

ICE Comments

- **Question for GLWACH:** Can we explore the option of extending Behavioral Health Appointments for minors to accommodate the after school availability? Currently BMD for the children can have their last patient at 1600 hrs. Unfortunately, the students don't get out of school until 1430-1530, depending on grade level. Some installations use a flex schedule to allow later appointments time. Currently the absent policy is 5 absences per semester, and the school district ask that we schedule outside of school hours for appointments. If we allowed 2 appointments a day past 1600-that would accommodate 10 additional patients and would not cause additional issues with attendance policy with school district. Especially with the increase of quarantines, isolations, and virtual academia, we should explore ways to keep kids in school without jeopardizing their mental health due to non-availability of appointments.

The Behavioral Health Dept has evaluated the resources needed to implement this change. At this time they currently do not have the administrative support to accomplish this.

ICE Comments

- **Question for Commissary:** Please consider opening the commissary earlier than 10am at least 3 days a week. Trying to stay out of local high risk places that open earlier.

Effective Friday February 26, 2021 the Commissary received authorization to open to the public at 9 AM Monday thru Saturday and Sunday 10 AM. Early Bird is still not authorized at this time – watch for more information.

- **Question for CYS Youth Sports:** The kids need sports. When will on post youth sports restart?

Per IMCOM Guidance Youth Sports are not to resume until HPCON B and with the approval of the local leadership. MWR CYS is developing a way ahead for Youth Sports under HPCON Charlie as well as what Youth Sports looks like under HPCON Bravo. Youth Sports is developing courses of action to be able to provide small group or one on one clinics.
